Make a list of all the things one can find in a modern classroom, which are missing from this classroom. Then put the words into groups.

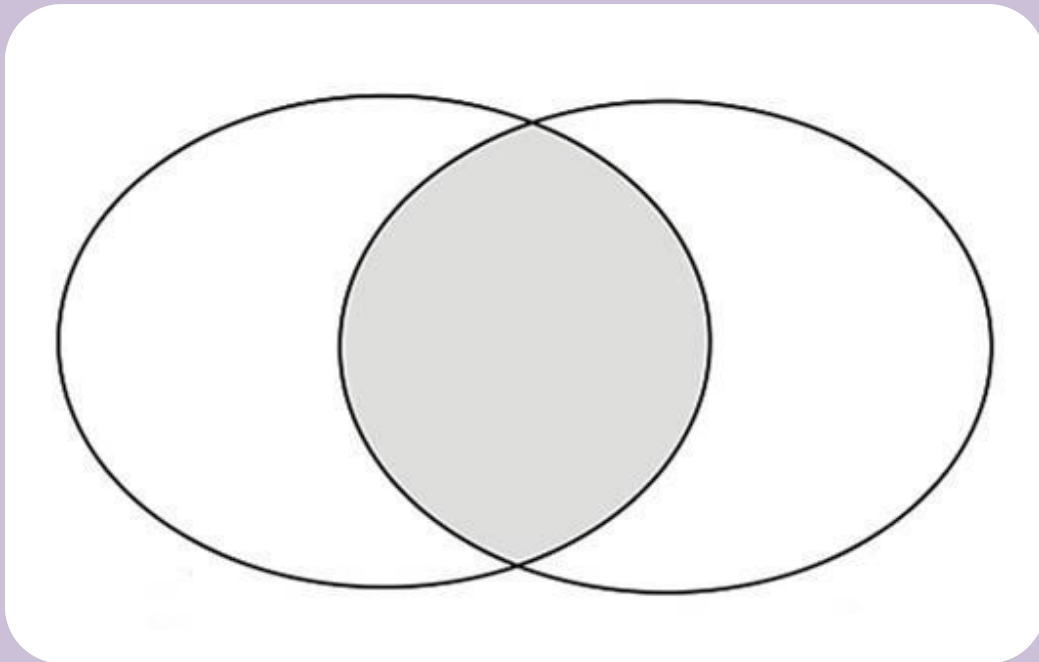


WORKSHEET 4
