

## Common AR history lesson

**Task:** Work together to create a shared history lesson about Ancient Egypt.

**Output:** All videos from the participating schools will be combined into one final video.

**Software:** ARLOOPA

### Specifications:

Each video should show the character in front of the school board. No pupils should appear on screen; only their voices should be heard. Please try to keep background noise to a minimum.

### Instructions:

1. Install ARLOOPA on the teacher's phone (you may use the same app from previous activities, but update to the latest version if needed).
2. Open the app and go to: **Gallery → Cultural Heritage and History → Egypt.**
3. Record a video presenting your assigned character using exactly three sentences. Three pupils may speak, with each pupil saying one sentence.
4. Save the video and send it to me. If necessary, you may record the video again to improve quality.

## Characters & Phrases

### Greece 5<sup>th</sup> Gymnasium – Statue of Osiris

This statue shows Osiris, the ancient Egyptian god of the afterlife and rebirth. He is usually shown standing straight, wrapped like a mummy, to show his power over life after death. Egyptians believed Osiris judged the souls of the dead.

### Greece 3<sup>rd</sup> Iliion - Coffin of Mut-iy-iy

This coffin was made to protect the body of a woman named Mut-iy-iy after her death. It is often decorated with painted texts and images meant to help her in the afterlife. Coffins like this show how important burial rituals were in ancient Egypt.

### Croatia - Sekhmet

This statue represents Sekhmet, the powerful goddess of war and healing. She is shown with the head of a lioness to symbolize strength and danger. Egyptians prayed to Sekhmet for protection from disease and disasters.

### Italy – Statue of Khafre

This statue shows Pharaoh Khafre, a ruler of ancient Egypt during the Old Kingdom. He is shown sitting calmly, which shows his strength and authority as king. The statue was made to last forever and honor him in the afterlife.

### Lithuania – Cat

This statue shows a cat, an animal that was very special in ancient Egypt. Cats were linked to protection and were often kept as pets. Many cat statues were made to honor the gods and bring good luck.

### Sweden – Pyramid

A pyramid is a large stone tomb built for a king or queen. It was designed to protect the ruler's body and treasures. Egyptians believed pyramids helped the soul travel to the afterlife.

### Ukraine – Amun Ram Ashmolean

This statue shows the god Amun in the form of a ram, an animal linked to strength and creation. Amun was one of the most important gods in ancient Egypt. The statue is now kept in the Ashmolean Museum, where it helps people learn about Egyptian religion.
