Conditionals

If + Present --→ will + bare infinitive (1st) (possible)

E. g. If I have time tomorrow, I will send you a letter. (80%)

If + Past ---→ would + bare infinitive (2nd) (impossible)

E.g. If I won the lotto tomorrow, I would take all of you to the Bahamas. (20%)
