Student B

- Weave; to lace together (threads, strands, etc.) so as to form a fabric
- Sew; to join or attach (one or more things) by stitches

- Fiber; a fine, threadlike piece, such as cotton
- Thread; a thin, fine cord of fiber spun out to great length
- Spin; to make (yarn) by drawing out, twisting, and winding fibers
- Knit; to make (a garment, fabric, etc.) by joining or interlocking loops of yarn by hand with knitting needles or by machine

Student C

weave: to make cloth by repeatedly crossing a single thread through two sets of long threads on a loom

sew: to join two pieces of cloth together by putting thread through them with a needle

fiber: any of the thin parts like thread that form plant or artificial material esp. those that can be made into cloth or a mass of such parts twisted together

thread: a long, thin line of something such as light or smoke

spin: to turn around and around especially fast

knit: to make clothes by using two long needles to connect wool or another type of thread into joined rows
