memorial	<i>noun</i>	an object, often large and made of stone, that has been built to honour a famous person or event
dedication	<i>noun</i>	a ceremony in which a building, especially a religious building, is opened for use and its purpose is stated
dedication	<i>noun</i>	the willingness to give a lot of time and energy to something because it is important
dedicate	<i>verb</i>	If you dedicate a book, play, performance, etc. to someone, you publicly say that it is in that person's honour
dedicate	<i>verb</i>	to give all of your energy, time, etc.
congress	<i>noun</i>	a large formal meeting of representatives from countries or societies at which ideas are discussed and information is exchanged
congressional	<i>adjective</i>	belonging or related to the US Congress
congregational	<i>adjective</i>	relating to a group of people who have come together in a religious building for worship and prayer
congregation	<i>noun</i>	a group of people who have come together in a religious building for worship and prayer
posthumous	<i>adjective</i>	happening after a person's death
assassin	<i>noun</i>	someone who kills a famous or important person, usually for political reasons or in exchange for money
assassination	<i>noun</i>	the murder of someone famous or important
assassinate	<i>verb</i>	to kill someone famous or important
expand	<i>verb</i>	to increase in size, number, or importance, or to make something increase in this way
combat	<i>verb</i>	to try to stop something unpleasant or harmful from happening or increasing
combat	<i>noun</i>	a fight, especially during a war
deliver	<i>verb</i>	to give or produce a speech or result
deliver	<i>verb</i>	to take goods, letters, parcels, etc. to people's houses or places of work
conference	<i>noun</i>	a large, formal meeting at which there are groups of talks on a particular subject, or a small, private meeting for discussion of a particular matter
conference	<i>noun</i>	an event, sometimes lasting a few days, at which there is a group of talks on a particular subject, or a meeting in which especially business matters are discussed formally
secure	<i>adjective</i>	likely to continue and not fail or be lost

secure	<i>verb</i>	to get something, sometimes with difficulty
racial	<i>adjective</i>	based on someone's perceived race, especially in a way that is unfair or harmful; or based on policies, behaviours, rules, etc. that result in unfair or harmful treatment of people because of their perceived race
accomplishment	<i>noun</i>	something that is successful, or that is achieved after a lot of work or effort
accomplish	<i>verb</i>	to finish something successfully or to achieve something
encompass	<i>verb</i>	to include different types of things
the grassroots	<i>noun</i>	the ordinary people in a society or an organization, especially a political party
impact	<i>noun</i>	a powerful effect that something, especially something new, has on a situation or person
impact	<i>noun</i>	the force or action of one object hitting another
Reconstruction	<i>noun</i>	the period after the US Civil War from 1863 to 1877 when the southern states were brought back into the nation
movement	<i>noun</i>	a group of people with a particular set of aims
advance	<i>noun</i>	the forward movement of something, or an improvement or development in something
advance	<i>verb</i>	to suggest an idea or theory
advance	<i>verb</i>	to go or move something forward, or to develop or improve something
spokeswoman	<i>noun</i>	a woman who is chosen to speak officially for a group or organization
spokesperson	<i>noun</i>	a person who is chosen to speak officially for a group or organization
spokesman	<i>noun</i>	someone who is chosen by a group or organization to speak officially to the public for them
minister	<i>noun</i>	a religious leader in certain Christian churches
minister	<i>noun</i>	a member of the government in Britain and many other countries who is in charge of a particular department or has an important position in it
march	<i>verb</i>	to walk with regular steps and keeping the body stiff, usually in a formal group of people who are all walking in the same way
march	<i>verb</i>	to walk through a public place as part of a public event to express support for something, or disagreement with or disapproval of something
march	<i>noun</i>	a walk, especially by a group of soldiers all walking with the same movement and speed
march	<i>noun</i>	a piece of music with a strong, regular beat, written for marching to
march	<i>noun</i>	an event in which a large number of people walk through a public place to express their support for something, or their disagreement with or disapproval of something

discrimination	<i>noun</i>	treating a person or particular group of people differently, especially in a worse way from the way in which you treat other people, because of their skin colour, sex, sexuality, etc.
discriminate	<i>verb</i>	to treat a person or particular group of people differently, especially in a worse way from the way in which you treat other people, because of their skin colour, sex, sexuality, etc.
riot	<i>noun</i>	an occasion when a large number of people behave in a noisy, violent, and uncontrolled way in public, often as a protest
violation	<i>noun</i>	an action that breaks or acts against something, especially a law, agreement, principle, or something that should be treated with respect
violate	<i>verb</i>	to break or act against something, especially a law, agreement, principle, or something that should be treated with respect
violent	<i>adjective</i>	using force to hurt or attack
violence	<i>noun</i>	actions or words that are intended to hurt people
inequality	<i>noun</i>	the unfair situation in society when some people have more opportunities, money, etc. than other people
federation	<i>noun</i>	a group of organizations, countries, regions, etc. that have joined together to form a larger organization or government
federal	<i>adjective</i>	A federal system of government consists of a group of regions that are controlled by a central government.
federal	<i>adjective</i>	relating to the central government, and not to the government of a region, of some countries such as the US
oppositional	<i>adjective</i>	relating to or based on one group opposing another
oppositional	<i>adjective</i>	refusing to obey instructions or to do what people want you to do
opposition	<i>noun</i>	strong disagreement
segregation	<i>noun</i>	the policy of keeping one group of people apart from another and treating them differently, especially because of race, sex, or religion
segregate	<i>verb</i>	to keep one thing separate from another
legislation	<i>noun</i>	a law or set of laws suggested by a government and made official by a parliament
legislative	<i>adjective</i>	relating to laws or the making of laws
civilization	<i>noun</i>	human society with its well developed social organizations, or the culture and way of life of a society or country at a particular period in time
civil rights	<i>noun</i>	the rights that each person has in a society, whatever their race, sex, or religion
civilian	<i>noun</i>	a person who is not a member of the police or the armed forces
