Lesson 11 – Images (II)

1. (If you haven't already done so from the previous lesson, create a folder, inside your folder, named Sporades and inside it create a folder named images)
2. Open the website *skiathos.html* (the "home page of the Sporades") located in the *Sporades* folder in Notepad .
3. Immediately after the word **Skiathos:** write the following: `<|>The island of Skiathos...</|>`.
4. Before the text you just wrote, insert the image of Skiathos that you downloaded in the previous lesson and is stored in the *images* folder. To do this, use the `` tag as follows:

```
<IMG SRC="images/Skiathos.jpg">
```

5. Save (*File Save*) and see the result in the browser. You will notice that the text after the image appears to the right and at the bottom of the image. Not very nice...
6. Make the text after the image appear **in the middle of the image**, i.e. add the `align="middle"` parameter to the image tag. Save again and see the result in the browser.
7. Now, immediately after the phrase "The island of Skiathos..." leave two blank lines. See the result...
8. Add some **explanatory text** to the image (e.g. Skiathos), using the `alt` parameter, i.e. `alt = "Skiathos"`. Save and see the change in the browser. It's not your eyes' fault, nothing has changed!! Hover over the image (without clicking). Then, you will see something new!
9. Specify the **width and height** of the image in pixels, using the `width` parameters and `height`, e.g. `width=400 height=350`. You will notice that the image size has changed. Experiment a bit with different values for the width and height of the image and see the results. Feel free to use quite large numbers. What do you notice?
10. Now set a percentage for the width and height of the image, e.g. `width=40% height=35%`. Save and see the results. Resize the browser window. Does the image size remain constant?

After you are finished with the Skiathos website, repeat all the previous steps for the Skopelos website . For **step 2**, write the phrase given to you immediately after the yellow line.
