There are also a number of <u>verbs</u> that don't take the continuous forms in one meaning but DO take the continuous forms in other meanings. Here are some of the most important:

Verb	Non-Continuous Meanings	Continuous Meanings
Feel	'have an opinion' - He feel he should get a second chance.	s'feel physically' - I'm feeling awful this afternoon.
See	'understand' - I see what you mean.	'visit' - She's seeing a doctor this morning.
Think	'have an opinion' - I think we should leave immediately.	'use the brain' - He's thinking hard about the problem.
Арреа	r 'look like' - That appears to be stale.	'be on stage / perform' - Jack Daniels is appearing at the Paramount tonight.
Look	'seem' - It looks impossible!	'stare at' - I'm looking at that strange man.
Taste	'have a taste' - That tastes yummy!	'use the mouth' - <i>The cook is tasting the sauce!</i>
Weigh	'have weight' – The bag weighs three kilos.	'try to find the weight' – I am weighing the bag to find out how heavy it is.
Smell	'has a smell' – The food smells horrible.	'use the nose' - <i>Why are you smelling the food?</i>
	'possession' - I have a nice office/ a house.	'eat, drink, do, enjoy' - She is having a baby. / We are having a nice time.
Be	'personality trait' - <i>You</i> are stupid.	'acting or behaving in a specific way temporarily' - I don't know what is wrong with you but you're being stupid.
