Agency (n)	a government organization
Experiment (n)	a test done in order to learn something or to discover if something works or is true
Stroke (n)	a sudden change in the blood supply to a part of the brain, sometimes causing a loss of the ability to move particular parts of the body
Condition (n)	any of different types of diseases
Desperate (adj)	needing or wanting something very much
Underestimate (v)	to fail to guess or understand the real cost, size, difficulty, etc. of something
Lack (v)	to not have or not have enough of something that is needed or wanted
Pinpoint (v)	to discover or describe the exact facts about something
Effect (n)	the result of a particular influence
Scrutiny (n)	the careful and detailed examination of something in order to get information about it
Poorly (adv)	Not well
Culminate(v)	If an event or series of events culminates in something, it ends with it, having developed until it reaches this point
Council (n)	a group of people elected or chosen to make decisions or give advice on a particular subject, to represent a particular group of people, or to run a particular organization
Announce (v)	to make something known or tell people about something officially
Guideline (n)	information intended to advise people on how something should be done or what something should be
Physiological (adj)	relating to the way in which the bodies of living things work

Generate (v)	produce
Robust (adj)	(of an object or system) strong and unlikely to break or fail
Awareness (n)	knowledge that something exists, or understanding of a situation or subject at the present time based on information or experience
Sufficiently (adv)	Enough
Procedure (n)	a set of actions that is the official or accepted way of doing something
Breed (v)	to keep animals for the purpose of producing young animals in a controlled way
Trial (n)	A test, usually over a limited period of time, to discover how effective or suitable something or someone is
Launch (v)	to begin something such as a plan or introduce something new such as a product
Policy (n)	a set of ideas or a plan for action followed by a business, a government, a political party, or a group of people
Ethically (adv)	Morally
Questionable (adj)	not certain, or wrong in some way
