

CONDITIONALS

TYPE 0	If + present	present		present	real
TYPE 1	If + present	will/can/may	do	present	real
TYPE 2	If + past	would/could/might	do	present	unreal
TYPE 3	If + past perfect	would/could/might	have done	past	unreal

TYPE 0 If/When I study, I do well in my exams.

TYPE 1 If I study, I will do well in my exam.

TYPE 2 If I studied, I would do well in my exams.

TYPE 3 If I had studied, I would have done well in my exam.

Conditionals with INVERSION

- TYPE 1 Should** If you (should) have any questions, I will be happy to help.
 Should you have any questions, I will be happy to help.
 Should you not consent to sharing this information, you may inform our company at any time.
- TYPE 2 Were** If I were you, I would study more.
 Were I you, I would study more.
 If they sold their house today, they would make a huge profit on it.
 Were they to sell their house today, they would make a huge profit on it.
 Were I not good at maths, I'd find this homework very challenging.
- TYPE 3 Had** I would've taken you out for lunch if I had known you were in town.
 I would've taken you out for lunch had I known you were in town.
 Had I not been busy this morning, I would have attended the meeting.

To make negative inverted conditionals, we put not after the subject.
