

Describe the use of each of the terms in bold below:

Mooring winch= mechanical device for pulling on a rope used for mooring . It may be hand operated or powered.

Bow ramp= provides access from the main deck to the shore. When in its stowed position it doubles up as the inner door.

Bollard(bol or bole)= (the round trunk of a tree)= a substantial vertical pillar to which lines may be made fast. Generally on the quayside or on the ship. .

Anchor= any object designed to prevent or slow the drift of a ship by a line or chain.

Targets= indications of an object on a display

Traffic lanes= shipping corridors marked by buoys that separate incoming from outcoming vessels.

Capstan= a large winch with a vertical axis used to wind in anchors, or to hoist heavy objects

Windlass= winch mechanism with horizontal axis designed to move very heavy loads (even raising the anchor on small ships)

Bob cat= A loader used to push materials from one location to another, carry materials around in its bucket and load them in trailers.

Anchor chain= a component that attaches and loads the anchor to the boat or structure.

Double Bitt= a pair of posts mounded on the ship's bow for fastening ropes or cables.

Search pattern= a search technique in navigation

Sling(s)= a band of ropes or iron for securing a yard to a mast. Chiefly in the plural (slings).
