

USED TO

We use *used to* + verb for talking about states or actions that were true or happened in the past, but are not true or do not happen now.

*My hometown is nothing like it **used to be**!*

*He **used to play** football when he was young.*

Used to is always for talking about actions or states in the past that are not true now.

*The café we **used to visit** on Saturdays is now an Italian restaurant. (We don't go there now.)*

We use *used to* to emphasize that the state or action is not true now or does not happen

Negative - Question

*She **didn't use to wear** these earrings but now she likes wearing them.*

*So what else **did you use to do** to when you were a child?*

Used to doesn't change - it's always in the past simple.
