PAST SIMPLE

Form

Regular verbs

I/You/He/She/It/We/You/They worked

Did I/you/he/she/it/we/you/they work?

I/You/He/She/It/We/You/They did not(didn't) work

Spelling Rules	
Ending in e add d <i>live – lived</i>	Ending in consonant + y change y to i and add ed <i>study – studied</i>
One syllable, single vowel and ending in single consonant double the final consonant and add ed <i>clap – clapped</i>	
Two-syllable, stress on second syllable and ending in single consonant double the final consonant and add ed <i>refer – referred</i>	
Two-syllable ending in -l double the -l and add ed <i>travel – travelled</i>	

Irregular verbs (Pupil's Book p.)

I/You/He/She/It/We/You/They ate

Did I/you/he/she/it/we/you/they eat?

I/You/He/She/It/We/You/They did not(didn't) eat

Use

We use the **Past Simple** to talk about :

- Actions that took place at a specific time in the past.

They came back last night.

- Actions that happened one after the other

He got up, p

ut on his clothes and left.

- Past habits

He played football when he was young.

PAST CONTINUOUS

Form

I was working	Was I working?	I was not (wasn't) working
You were working	Were you working?	You were not (weren't) working
He/She/It was working	Was he/she/it working?	He/She/It was not (wasn't) working
We/You/They were working	Were we/you/they working?	We/You/They were not (weren't) working

Spelling Rules

work - working
but
dance - dancing
consonant + e
stop - stopping
consonant + stressed vowel + consonant
refer - referring
but
suffer - suffering
last vowel: not stressed
travel - travelling
consonant + vowel + l
tie - tying

Use

We use the **Past Continuous** to talk about :

- An action that was in progress at a specific time in the past.

They were watching TV at 10 o'clock last night

- Two or more actions happening at the same time

He was listening to music while his wife was sleeping

Past Simple vs Past Continuous

Susan was washing the dishes when the phone rang.



action in progress



**sudden action that interrupted
the action in progress**

PAST SIMPLE - PAST CONTINUOUS : Time Expressions

Tom visited his grandma **yesterday**.

Jenny came back **at ten o' clock**.

Bob called me **last night**.

Christine bought this bracelet **two days ago**.

They moved to France **last year**.

First, she had a shower, **then** she put on her clothes . **After that**, she had breakfast. **Finally**, she left the house.

Max was watching TV **at 9 o'clock last night**.

Betty was listenng to music **while** Nick was reading a book.

As she was skiing, she broke her leg.

Mark was working on the computer **when** the lights went out.
