ADJECTIVE	ADVERB	
	IRREGULAR	REGULAR
late		not lately (=recently)
free		moving freely (=no limit)
high		highly sensitive (=very)
deep		deeply sorry (=very)
hard		hardly know (=almost never)

Notes:

1. **Adjectives:** friendly, lonely, silly, ugly, lovely etc. **BUT:** *in a* friendly/silly etc. way
2. **look, smell, sound, feel, taste + adjective**
