



Leaders: Born or Made?

Here are some words and phrases that will help you understand the unit, along with their meanings and Greek translations:

- **civil rights:** The basic rights that everyone has, like freedom and equality, no matter their race, religion, gender, or skin color. (πολιτικά δικαιώματα)
- **legislative:** Related to laws or the process of making laws. (νομοθετικός)
- **segregation:** The separation of people into different groups, especially based on race. (διαχωρισμός, απομόνωση)
- **opposition:** The act of disagreeing with or fighting against something. (αντίδραση αντίθεση, αντίσταση)
- **federal:** Relating to a system of government where power is shared between a central government and individual states. (ομοσπονδιακός)
- **riots:** Violent and noisy public disturbances. (ταραχές, επεισόδια)
- **discrimination:** Treating people unfairly based on things like their race, age, gender, or disability. (διάκριση, διαχωρισμός)
- **march:** A large group of people walking together to show support for something or to protest something. (πορεία, παρέλαση)
- **minister:** A religious leader, like a pastor or priest. (ιερέας)
- **spokesperson:** Someone who speaks for a group of people. (εκπρόσωπος)
- **grassroots:** Ordinary people, especially those involved in a political movement. (ο απλός λαός)
- **to encompass:** To include or surround something completely. (περιβάλλω, περικλείω)
- **to boycott:** To refuse to buy or use something as a form of protest. (αποκλείω, μπουκοτάρω)
- **to deliver a speech:** To give a formal talk to an audience. (εκφωνώ λόγο)
- **to combat:** To fight against something. (μάχομαι, πολεμώ, αγωνίζομαι)
- **posthumously:** After someone has died. (μετά θάνατον)
- **resistance:** The act of opposing something. (αντίσταση, αντίδραση)
- **to assassinate:** To murder an important person for political reasons. (δολοφονώ)
- **to dedicate to:** To honor someone by naming something after them. (αφιερώνω σε)
- **civil war:** A war between groups of people from the same country. (εμφύλιος πόλεμος)

- **coalition:** A group of political parties that join together for a specific purpose. (συνασπισμός)
- **revolutionary:** Someone who wants to bring about a major change in society. (επαναστάτης)
- **constitution:** The set of laws and principles that a country is governed by. (σύνταγμα)
- **abuse:** Cruel or unfair treatment. (παραβίαση)
- **reconciliation:** The process of restoring friendly relations. (συμφιλίωση)
- **to overthrow:** To remove someone from power, often by force. (ανατρέπω, ανατροπή)
- **to dismantle:** To take something apart. (διαλύω, αποδομώ αποσυναρμολογώ)
- **legacy:** Something that is passed down from one generation to the next. (κληρονομιά)
- **institutionalized:** Something that has become a formal part of a system or organization. (θεσμοθετημένος)
- **to tackle:** To deal with a problem or issue. (αντιμετωπίζω, καταπάνομαι)
- **to foster:** To encourage or promote the development of something. (ενθαρρύνω, καλλιεργώ)
- **to privilege:** To give someone a special advantage. (δίνω προνόμια)
- **to commit myself to:** To promise to support a particular cause. (δεσμεύομαι)
- **amid:** In the middle of. (εν μέσω)
- **to release:** To set someone free from prison. (απελευθερώνω)
- **to negotiate:** To try to reach an agreement through discussion. (διαπραγματεύομαι)
- **to promulgate:** To make something widely known or put it into effect. (δημοσιεύω, εκδίδω)
- **clan:** A group of people related by blood or ancestry; a tribe. (φυλή)
- **to wallow:** To roll around in something, like mud or water. (κυλιέμαι, κολυμπώ)
- **despair:** A complete loss of hope. (απόγνωση, απελπισία)
- **creed:** A set of beliefs or principles. (δόγμα, πιστεύω)
- **self-evident:** Obvious and needing no proof. (ολοφάνερος, αυταπόδεικτος)
- **sweltering with:** Very hot and uncomfortable. («βράζει από» μτφ)
- **oppression:** Cruel and unfair treatment. (καταπίεση)
- **content:** The substance or meaning of something. (περιεχόμενο, ουσία)
- **vicious:** Cruel and evil. (κακός, μοχθηρός, ανήθικος)
- **to drip:** To fall in drops. (στάζω)
- **interposition:** Interference or intervention. (παρέμβαση, διακοπή)
- **nullification:** The act of canceling something out. (ακύρωση, εκμηδενισμός)
- **to exalt:** To praise someone highly. (εξυμνώ, εξυψώνω)
- **crooked:** Not straight. (στριφτός, αγκυλωτός)
- **prodigious:** Amazing or impressive. (θαυμαστός, καταπληκτικός)
- **mighty:** Strong and powerful. (μέγας, ισχυρός)
- **curvaceous:** Having attractive curves. (καμπυλωτός)
- **malnutrition:** A lack of proper nutrition. (υποσιτισμός)
- **tuberculosis:** A serious infectious disease that affects the lungs. (φυματίωση)
- **pellagra:** A disease caused by a lack of certain vitamins. (πελάγρα)
- **scurvy:** A disease caused by a lack of vitamin C. (σκορβούτο)
- **to preserve:** To keep something in its original condition. (διατηρώ, συντηρώ)
- **advancement:** Improvement or progress. (πρόοδος, προαγωγή)
- **deliberately:** On purpose. (εσκεμμένα, σκόπιμα)
- **to curtail:** To reduce or limit something. (περικόπτω)
- **to seek:** To try to achieve something. (επιδιώκω)

- **to hamper:** To make something difficult. (παρακωλύω, παρεμποδίζω, ενοχλώ)
- **subsidy:** Money given by the government to help lower prices. (επιδότηση, επιχορήγηση)
- **supplement:** Something that is added to complete something else. (συμπλήρωμα)
- **compulsory:** Required by law. (υποχρεωτικός)
- **virtually:** Almost or nearly. (ουσιαστικά, στην πραγματικότητα)
- **breakdown:** A failure or collapse. (κατάρρευση, αποτυχία)
- **alarming:** Worrying or disturbing. (ανησυχητικός)
- **illegitimacy:** The state of being illegal. (παρανομία)
- **to erupt:** To explode or burst out. (εκρήγνυμαι, ξεσπώ)
- **township:** In South Africa, a Black neighborhood or city. (κοινότητες των μαύρων)
- **to stab:** To pierce someone with a pointed object. (μαχαιρώνω, καρφώνω)
- **to assault:** To attack someone violently. (επιτίθεμαι)
- **to impose:** To force someone to accept something. (επιβάλλω)
- **death sentence:** A punishment of being put to death. (θανατική ποινή)
- **offence:** A crime or wrongdoing. (αδίκημα, παράπτωμα)
- **a festering sore:** A wound that is infected and producing pus. (πληγή που πυορροεί/κακοφορμίζει)
- **artificial:** Made by humans, not natural. (τεχνητός, ψεύτικος)
- **domination:** Control or power over others. (Κυριαρχία, υπεροχή, επικράτηση)
- **to dedicate myself to:** To commit myself to a particular purpose. (αφιερώνομαι σε)
- **to cherish:** To hold something dear and protect it. (αγαπώ, τρέφω (ενδόμυχα))
- **virtue:** A good quality or trait. (αρετή)
- **moral worth:** The value of someone's character based on what is right and wrong. (ηθική αξία)
- **reputation:** What people think about someone or something. (φήμη, υπόληψη)
- **authority:** The power to control or influence others. (εξουσία, δικαιοδοσία)
- **an appeal:** The power to attract or interest people. (έλξη, συγκίνηση)
- **maxim:** A general truth or rule of conduct. (απόφθεγμα, αξιώματα)
- **indisputable fact:** Something that cannot be argued or questioned. (αδιαμφισβήτητο γεγονός)
- **to induce:** To cause something to happen. (προκαλώ, επιφέρω)
- **simile:** A figure of speech that compares two things using "like" or "as." (παρομοίωση)
- **an abstract notion:** An idea that is not concrete or physical. (αφηρημένη έννοια)
- **persuasive:** Able to convince others. (πειστικός)
- **eloquent:** Fluent and persuasive in speaking or writing. (εύγλωττος)
- **intellectual:** Relating to the ability to think and understand things. (διανοητικός, πνευματικός)
- **well-substantiated:** Supported by evidence. (καλά εμπειριστατωμένος)
- **betterment:** Improvement. (βελτίωση)
- **strive:** To try hard to achieve something. (πασχίζω)
- **branch:** A local office or division of a larger organization. (τμήμα, παράρτημα, υποκατάστημα)
- **mentorship:** Guidance and advice from an experienced person. (καθοδήγηση)
- **soup kitchen:** A place where free food is served to needy people. (συσίτιο)
- **shortage:** A lack of something. (έλλειψη)
- **literally:** In the exact meaning of the word. (κυριολεκτικά)
- **to be on the up and up:** To be honest and sincere, or to become more successful. (είμαι ειλικρινής / επιτυχημένος)
- **heritage:** Something that is passed down from previous generations. (κληρονομιά)

- **to brush up:** To review and improve your knowledge of something. («φρεσκάρω» τις γνώσεις μου)
- **to bridge:** To connect or reduce the gap between two things. (γεφυρώνω)
- **gap:** A space or difference between two things. (χάσμα, κενό)
- **daunting:** Intimidating or discouraging. (αποθαρρυντικό)
- **dedication:** Commitment and devotion to something. (αφοσίωση)
- **nurture:** To care for and encourage the growth of something. (καλλιεργώ, θρέφω)
- **vital:** Necessary or essential. (σημαντικό)
- **globally:** Worldwide. (παγκοσμίως)
- **to stand up for:** To defend or support something. (υπερασπίζομαι, διεκδικώ δικαιώματα)
- **considerate:** Thoughtful and respectful of others. (προσεκτικός, συνετός, που ενδιαφέρεται και υπολογίζει τους άλλους)
- **attribute:** A quality or characteristic. (χαρακτηριστικό γνώρισμα)
- **attitude:** A way of thinking or feeling about something. (διάθεση)
- **implement:** To put a plan or system into effect. (εφαρμόζω)
- **gateway:** An entrance or means of access. (είσοδος)
- **inclusive:** Open to everyone; not excluding anyone. (που δεν αποκλείει κανέναν)
