	a small, thin branch of a tree or bush
	to limit the amount of a particular thing that someone is allowed to have
	a fight or argument
	(of a person or a person's opinions) fixed and not easily changed
	a number of things that have been fastened or are held together
	very hot
	an amount that is enough
	unsuccessfully
	to make someone remember something or feel an emotion
	use, purpose, advantage or profit
	a dead body, usually of a person
	to bend your knees and lower yourself so that you are close to the ground and leaning forward slightly
