Martin Luther King Jr. (p.83) Match the words from the wordbox at the top of the page with their meanings.

Segregation	the policy of keeping one group of people apart from another and treating them differently, especially because of race, sex, or religion
Inequality	a lack of equality or fair treatment in the sharing of wealth or opportunities
March	an event in which many people walk through a public place to express their support of something, often in disapproval of an official position
Civil rights	the rights that each person has in a society, whatever their race, sex, or religion
Riot	an occasion when a large number of people behave in a noisy, violent, and uncontrolled way in public, often as a protest
Opposition	disagreement with something, often by speaking or fighting against it
Discrimination	treating a person or particular group of people differently, especially in a worse way from the way in which you treat other people, because of their skin colour, sex, sexuality, etc
Nonviolent	not using violent methods, esp. to cause a political or social change
Legislative	relating to laws or the making of laws
Federal	relating to the central government, and not to the government of a region, of some countries such as the US

Coalition	a group formed of different organizations or people who agree to act together, usually temporarily, to achieve something
Abuse	cruel, violent, or unfair treatment of someone
Elected	a person that is chosen for a particular job, by voting
Foster	to encourage the development or growth of ideas or feelings
Civil	of or relating to the ordinary people of a country, rather than members of religious organizations or the military
Constitution	the set of political principles by which a state or organization is governed, especially in relation to the rights of the people it governs
Reconciliation	a situation in which two people or groups of people become friendly again after they have argued
Racism	the belief that some races are better than others, or the unfair treatment of someone because of his or her race
Overthrow	to remove from power, esp. by force
Revolutionary	relating to a complete change in a system of government, or bringing or causing great change
